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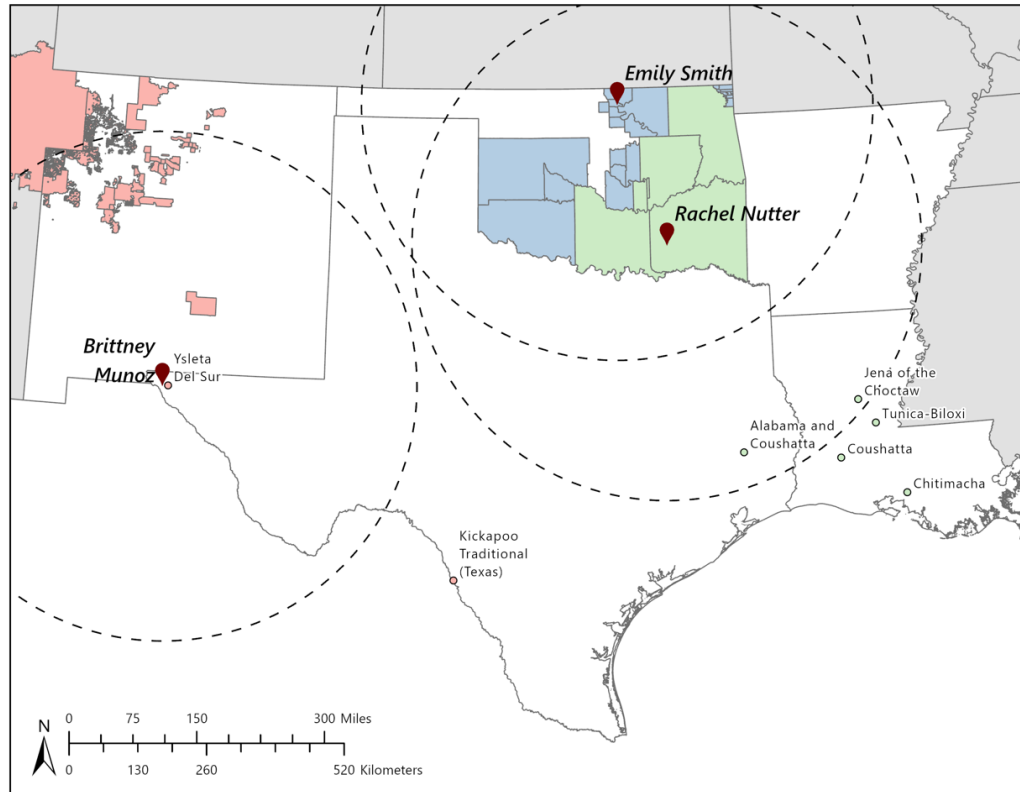

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

## Emergency Response Cooperation

This Memorandum of Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of [DATE] by and between the Shoshone-Paiute Tribes (hereinafter referred to as the "Tribes") and the Center for Domestic Preparedness (hereinafter referred to as the "CDP").

**WHEREAS**, the Tribes are recognized sovereign governments with the inherent authority and responsibility to protect the health, safety, and welfare of their citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the CDP is a national training facility administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) dedicated to improving the nation's preparedness for all-hazards emergencies; and

**WHEREAS**, both the Tribes and the CDP desire to establish a cooperative framework to enhance emergency response capabilities on the Shoshone-Paiute Tribal Lands.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing premises and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish a collaborative relationship between the Tribes and the CDP to:

- Enhance communication and coordination during emergency response efforts.
- Facilitate the exchange of information and resources related to emergency preparedness, response, and recovery.
- Identify and develop training opportunities for tribal emergency responders.
- Explore grant opportunities to support emergency preparedness initiatives on the Shoshone-Paiute Tribal Lands.

### 2. Responsibilities

#### A. Tribes

- Designate a point of contact for communication and coordination with the CDP.
- Provide the CDP with relevant information on tribal emergency response plans and procedures.
- Identify specific training needs for tribal emergency responders.
- Participate in joint training exercises, as mutually agreed upon.

#### B. CDP





- Designate a point of contact for communication and coordination with the Tribes.
- Share best practices and resources related to emergency preparedness, response, and recovery.
- Develop and deliver training programs tailored to the specific needs of tribal emergency responders, as resources allow.
- Assist the Tribes in identifying potential grant funding opportunities for emergency preparedness initiatives.

### **3. Information Sharing**

The parties agree to share information relevant to emergency preparedness, response, and recovery in a timely and efficient manner. Information sharing will be done in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations, with **separate agreements regarding private tribal cultural sites.**

### **4. Training and Exercises**

The parties may jointly develop and conduct training exercises to enhance emergency response capabilities on the Shoshone-Paiute Tribal Lands. The scope and scale of such exercises will be determined on a case-by-case basis, considering available resources and mutual needs.

### **5. Grant Funding**

The parties may collaborate on identifying potential grant funding opportunities to support emergency preparedness initiatives on the Shoshone-Paiute Tribal Lands. The CDP may offer technical assistance in grant application development and training, as resources allow.

### **6. Term and Termination**

This Agreement shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of first signature below. This Agreement may be renewed upon written agreement of both parties. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

### **7. Entire Agreement**

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous communications, representations, or agreements, whether oral or written.

### **8. Amendment**





This Agreement may be amended only by a written agreement signed by both parties.

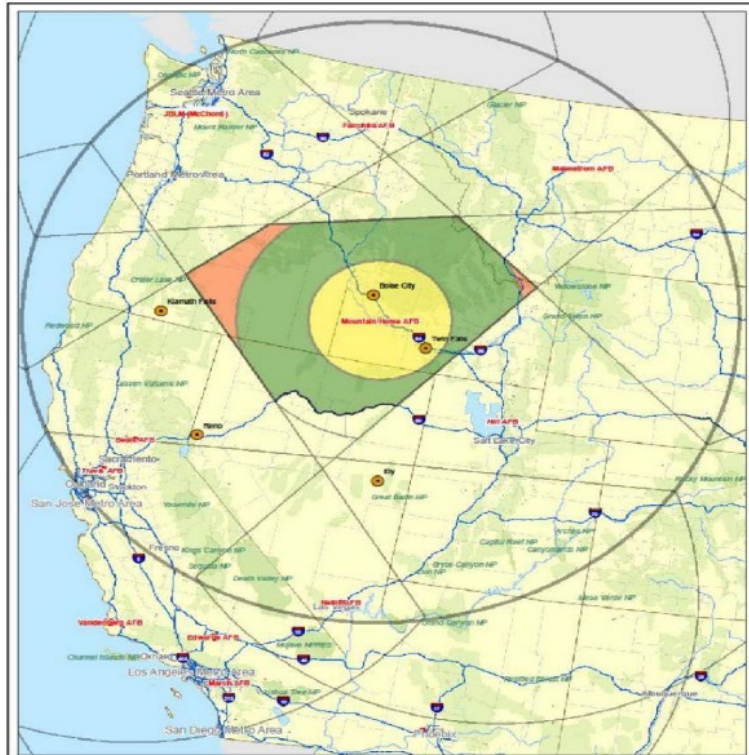

A.3.8. MHAFB AOR Map



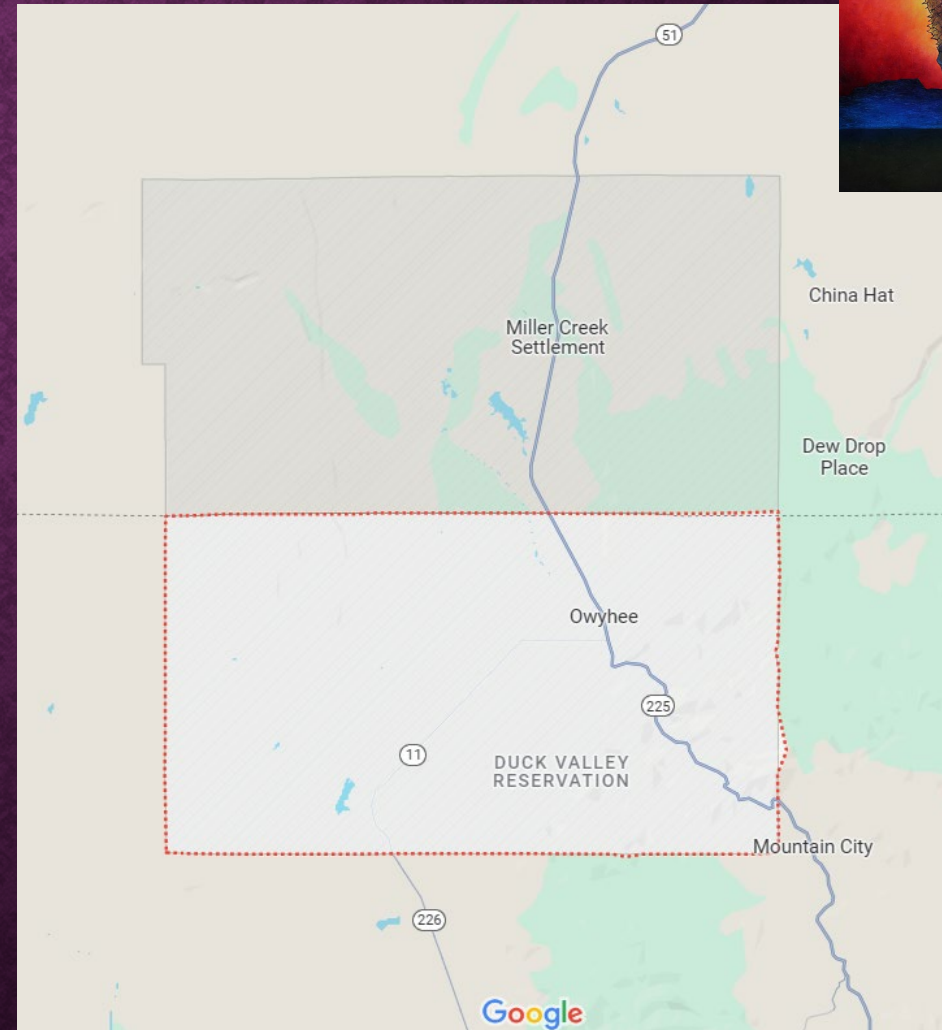
